## Panel seeks urgent steps for weavers' uplift

spate of suicide by weavers, a parliamentary panel has urged the government to take urgent steps for their welfare.

The Standing Committee on Labour led by CPI's S Sudhakar Reddy, which visited Sircilla in Andhra Pradesh where 23 weavers committed suicide in September and October, has in its report strongly recom-mended the setting up of a "handloom bank" on the pat-tern of Nabard and Sidbi.

It has also called for immediate setting up of "specialised branches in the highly concentrated zones of weavers from among nationalised cooperative banks" to provide soft loans to weavers. Since Parliament is not in session, the Standing Committee submitted its report

New Delhi: In the light of a condition of weavers," Reddy said. The panel, therefore, suggested setting up a "high level committee to evaluate the performance of all existing schemes" and recommended other steps to protect the interests of an estimated 1.20 crore weavers in both handloom and powerloom sectors.

Releasing the 44-page report, Reddy said the panel took "a very serious view" of the unusual incidents of suicide by weavers in the Sircilla area of Karimnagar district of Andhra Pradesh.

The report said over 300 cases of suicide have been reported in the past few years. "In Sirsila, the individual indebtedness of weavers ranged from Rs 60,000 to Rs 3 lakh," Reddy said. "Instead of distributing ex-gratia after the suicides and taking




