

- A combination of knowledge, skills and attitudes appropriate to the context is defined as Competency
- The framework for Foundational Literacy and Numeracy has been divided into Three developmental goals
- Each competency has been given a number/code for Easy identification and referencing
- The competency based education (CBE) is based on the idea that learners should be enabled to develop in-depth understanding of concepts and principles so that they can transfer the knowledge to real life situations.
- Activities like cutting, pasting, tearing, stringing the beads, fixing the puzzles, playing with blocks, and playing with clay, dough, sand, water lead to Fine muscle development
